INDIAN COAST GUARD DEPLOY DISASTER RELIEF TEAM TO WAYANAD LANDSLIDE AFFECTED AREA

New Delhi, 30 Jul 2024: In response to the landslide disaster in Wayanad, the Indian Coast Guard (ICG) District Headquarters (Kerala & Mahe) and ICG Station Beypore have dispatched Disaster Relief Teams (DRT) to the affected area. The teams are mobilized to provide immediate relief and support to the communities impacted by the disaster.
