INTRODUCTION

1. The Indian Coast Guard (ICG) was established through the Coast Guard Act, 1978 with the motto “वयम् रक्षामः” (Vayam Rakshamah) translating from Sanskrit as “We Protect”. The mission of the ICG encompasses ensuring Safety, Security and Law Enforcement at sea, providing Search and Rescue services, and protecting the Marine Environment.
2. In the month of February 2025, ICG maintained its operational tempo, carried out notable Search & Rescue (SAR), Medical Evacuation (Medevac), Anti-Poaching and Anti-Narcotics Operations.
3. On 01 Feb 2025, the Indian Coast Guard celebrated its “49th Raising Day”. On this occasion, various national dignitaries/ agencies and international agencies including Maritime Law Enforcement Agencies/ Coast Guards extended their best wishes to ICG.
4. ICG Investiture Ceremony – 2025 was held on 25 Feb 25 at Bharat Mandapam, New Delhi. On the occasion, the Hon’ble Raksha Mantri Shri Rajnath Singh conferred prestigious medals to ICG personnel for their distinguished and meritorious contribution to the nation. 32 awards including 06 President’s Tatrakshak Medals and 26 Tatrakshak Medals were presented.
5. The details of ICG operational activities undertaken during the month of Feb 25 are enumerated in this update.

MAJOR OPERATIONS

A. Anti-Poaching Operation.

In early Feb 25, ICG conducted anti-poaching operations, wherein security forces apprehended Five Myanmarse Poachers with two conventional dinghies from Landfall Island/ Creek and seized 480 kilograms Sea Cucumber. The apprehend dinghies and the poachers were handed over to A&N Police, Diglipur for further investigation/ disposal.

B. Anti-Smuggling Operation.

On 12 Feb 25, in an anti-smuggling operation, ICG seized 2000 kilograms of Dry Ginger worth ₹ 10 Lakhs from Muthupettai, TN. The consignment was handed over to Tamil Nadu Police for further legal action.

A. Assistance to Fisherman - Medical Emergency onboard Indian Fishing Boat (IFB) Sri Renganathar Thunai (Regn No. IND-TN-06-MM-7959).


On 07 Feb 25, ICG received information from MV Valentina 1 regarding medical emergency onboard IFB Sri Renganathar Thunai operating in position 172 N miles West of Kavaratti. The patient was reported unconscious and merited urgent medical attention/ evacuation. ICG Ship Samarth was diverted to render immediate assistance. ICG ship evacuated the patient alongwith one escort and shifted to Indira Gandhi Govt. Hospital, Kavaratti for further medical management.

B. Assistance to Fisherman - Medical Emergency onboard Indian Fishing Boat (IFB) Bajrang Sagar (Regn No. IND-GJ-14-MM-1833).

On 19 Feb 25, ICG received information from Fisheries Association, Jafrabad regarding medical emergency onboard IFB Bajrang Sagar in position 39 N miles South-East of Jafrabad, Gujarat. The patient

sustained severe injury in right foot and medical evacuation was requested. ICG Interceptor Boat C-409 in area was immediately diverted to provide necessary assistance. ICG ship evacuated the patient along with one attendant to ashore, and handed over to the Fisheries Association, Jafrabad for further medical management.

C. SAR Efforts for Fire onboard Indian Fishing Boat (IFB) Ekvira Mauli (Regn No. IND-MH-03-MM-4922).

On 28 Feb 25, ICG Ship Savitri Bai Phule, whilst on patrol, received information about fire incident onboard IFB Ekvira Mauli (with 14 crew) in approx. position 69 N miles north west of Mumbai. ICG ship arrived scene of action and ascertained that fire had occurred in the engine room while it was towing a disabled Boat (IFB Dhanalaxmi). ICG Ship carried out firefighting using the ship's firefighting system, and brought the fire under control through sustained firefighting efforts. ICG ship also provided first aid to the injured survivors and shifted them to IFB Dhanalaxmi. The disabled IFBs were subsequently towed to Alibaug, Maharashtra.

COOPERATION WITH FOREIGN MARITIME AGENCIES

A. Maritime Cooperation: Gifting of ICG Interceptor Boat (IB) to Seychelles.

In a significant step towards enhancing maritime cooperation, India has formally gifted a state-of-the-art vessel (Interceptor Boat) to Seychelles Coast Guard (SCG). This gesture was made during a ceremony held at the Port Victoria, Seychelles on 25 Feb 25, presided over by the Hon'ble President of Seychelles, Mr. Wavel Ramkalawan. The vessel was commissioned into SCG as Patrol Boat (PB) Boudeuse. The commissioning of IB as PB Boudeuse, reinforces the cordial bilateral relations between India and Seychelles, especially the robust defence ties oriented towards greater maritime security in the region.

B. Maritime Cooperation: Overseas Deployment (OSD) of ICG Ship Shoor to UAE and Oman.

During a significant display of growing maritime cooperation between India and the United Arab Emirates and Oman, the ICG Ship Shoor as part of overseas deployment, visited UAE and Oman in Feb 25 for professional interactions and joint exercises with Coast Guards/ Maritime Law Enforcement Agencies of visiting countries. ICGS Shoor during a week-long stay at Abu Dhabi, UAE, participated in two major Defence exhibitions viz. Naval Defence Exhibition & Conference (NAVDEX) and International Defence Exhibition (IDEX-2025).

Further, the Offshore Patrol Vessel subsequently visited Muscat, Oman end Feb 25 and engaged with Royal Oman Police Coast Guard (ROPCG). During the visit, the ship conducted capacity building, Maritime SAR and joint training with ROPCG. The OSD served multiple objectives, beyond showcasing India's Maritime capabilities; it advances the country's 'SAGAR' (Security and Growth for All in the Region) initiatives.



C. Maritime Cooperation : Conduct of MRCC Ops & SAR Course at Mumbai.

As part of the Indian Technical and Economic Cooperation (ITEC) Programme, ICG/ MRCC Mumbai conducted MRCC Ops & SAR course for 22 international trainees from 06 Friendly Foreign Countries at Mumbai from 17 to 21 Feb 25. Training on Search and Rescue coordination, planning, execution & GMDSS system familiarization was conducted.

B. Coastal Surveillance Network (CSN).




The Control Centre (CC) of CSN undertakes trend analysis of the coastal maritime traffic and maritime incidents in Maritime Zones of India (MZI) and Indian Search & Rescue Region (ISRR). The maritime trends and analysis are utilized for undertaking remedial actions and planning counter operations to enhance Maritime Safety, Security and Environmental Protection. The trend analysis (maritime traffic, fishing activity and maritime incidents) for February 25 is enumerated in succeeding paragraphs.

C. Coastal Maritime Traffic.

The Centre monitored 19,656 distinct AIS transmissions on CS network along Indian coast in the month of Feb 25. Traffic share of India, Panama, Liberia, Marshal Island, China & Hong Kong and Singapore stood at 39%, 05%, 04%, 03%, 03% and 02% respectively. The larger share of India flagged traffic is attributed to coastal traffic. Traffic share of Cargo and Tanker vessels is 17% and 10% respectively. A total of 2,759 vessels were investigated by ICG ROSs. The state-wise, flag-wise and type-wise traffic pattern is depicted overleaf:-


D. Fishing Activity in North Indian Ocean.

A total of 3,756 Fishing Vessels (FVs) were observed transmitting on AIS in Northern Indian Ocean in the month of Feb 25. The analysis of fishing activities is based upon kinematics such as low speed. The data towards numbers of FVs have been garnered from AIS transmissions. However, the actual numbers of FVs may be higher than the reported data as many FVs may not be transmitting on AIS. The area-wise analysis of FVs operating in Bay of Bengal & Arabian Sea (beyond EEZ) and Indian EEZ for the month of Feb 25 is as follows:-

- (i) **Arabian Sea (Beyond EEZ).** Total of 596 FVs were observed transmitting on AIS and appreciated to be engaged in fishing. Out of these, numbers of Iranian, Chinese, Sri Lankan, Indian, Pakistani and


others FVs are 50%, 30%, 8%, 6%, 5% and 1% respectively. Seven Chinese flagged fish carrier (Reefers) were observed operating in Arabian Sea.




(ii) **Indian EEZ.** A total of 2,759 Indian flagged FVs were observed transmitting on AIS.

(iii) **Bay of Bengal (Beyond EEZ).** A total of 401 Sri Lankan and 18 Indian FVs were observed transmitting on AIS and appreciated to be engaged in fishing. No other flagged FVs observed transmitting on AIS in high seas, Bay of Bengal.

(i) **Maritime Incidents.** 20 Maritime incidents were reported in Feb 25, which included 17 distress/humanitarian incidents and 03 contraband seizures.

(aa) **Distress.** Two (02) incidents of distress were reported by Indian Fishing Boats which occurred due to fire (01) and capsizing (01). ICG responded to distress call, extinguished the fire and rescued crew safely. While another fiber boat capsized, while returning from sea. Out of four (04) crew, two (02) fishermen managed to reach shore, one (01) body was recovered and one (01) fishermen went missing.

(ab) **Stranded.** Two (02) incidents of stranded fishing boats were reported in month of Feb 25 due to mechanical failure. Both IFBs were towed by other fishing boats and reached harbour safely.

(ac) **Medial Emergency.** Medical Emergency was reported onboard four (04) IFBs and three MVs (03). ICG evacuated 04 patients and coordinated with other agencies for smooth evacuation of 03 patient.

(ad) **Man Overboard (MOB).** Two (02) cases of 'MOB' were reported from Indian Fishing Boats.

(ae) **Overdue.** Nil incident of boat overdue was reported in month of Feb 25.

(af) **Drowning.** Four (04) cases of beach drownings were reported from sea shore in Puduchery and Chennai.

(ii) **Contraband Seizure.** Three (03) incidents of contraband seizure were reported in month of Feb 25. ICG seized 50 bags weighing 2000 kgs Dry Ginger worth approx ₹ 10 lakhs from Muthupettai, Tamil Nadu while 480 kgs Sea Cucumber was seized from creeks of Landfall Islands in A&N Islands.

A. IMO Level-I Training for ICG Personnel.

To hone the Pollution Response skills of personnel, IMO Level-I training was conducted from 03 to 07 Feb 25 at Coast Guard Pollution Response Team (A&N). A total of 30 personnel from ICG units in Andaman and Nicobar Region, 05 representatives from ANC components (Army, Navy and Air Force) and 09 personnel from stakeholders participated in the training.

A. Purchase Made Through Government eMarketplace (GeM)/ Portal-Purchase via GeM.



Rajnath highlights new threats at sea

NEW DELHI: Defence minister Rajnath Singh on Tuesday put the spotlight on emerging unconventional threats at sea including cyber-attacks, data breach, signal jamming, radar disruption and GPS spoofing, asking the navy and the coast guard to stay alert to the challenges stemming from swift technological advancements.

"These challenges are in addition to conventional threats. The coast guard must stay vigilant to tackle both types of threats," Singh said at the Indian Coast Guard's 18th investiture ceremony.

"For years, all of you have stayed alert to eliminating the conventional threats. But as times change, we are now facing challenges of a different kind. In this era of technological advancement, we are facing challenges that are unconventional."

Singh presented 32 medals to coast guard personnel for their gallantry and distinguished service. In his speech, he touched upon the coast guard's transformation into "a formidable, trustworthy and one of the most efficient marine forces in the world." "India is surrounded by seas on three sides and its coastline is vast. The nation's security faces two types of threats. The first is war which is dealt

with by the armed forces, and the second includes the challenges of piracy, terrorism, infiltration, smuggling and illegal fishing for which the marine forces, especially coast guard, are always alert," he said.

Over the past year, the coast guard has seized 14 boats and apprehended 115 pirates, seized drugs worth ₹37,000 crore, and saved around 170 lives in a raft of rescue operations.

"The coast guard has been allocated ₹9,676 crore for the financial year 2025-26, which is 26.5% more than the previous year's budget. It is a crucial step towards modernising the coast guard. Also, the procurement of 14 fast patrol vessels, six air cushion vehicles, 22 interceptor boats, six next-generation off-shore patrol vessels and 18 next generation fast patrol vessels has been approved to make the coast guard stronger," Singh added.
